Countertops + Cabinet Colors

In the 2024 NKBA Kitchen Industry Survey, the trend is for countertops to be lighter than cabinet colors, with traditional and waterfall edges being popular.

Slab Backsplash & Countertop

Extending countertops into the back splash is a top design trend for 2024. This seamless look is easy to clean and creates a harmonious look in kitchens



Quartz Window Sill

Low maintenance and durable. Non-porous quartz is perfect for the kitchen sink areas exposed to water from sinks, cooking activities and condensation from window. Makes it a great location for houseplants, too!



Mitered Edge

Thick. Luxurious. Expensive Looking. A mitered edge uses two pieces of stone cut at 45 degree angles and put together with the seam at the corner to give the seamless appearance of a "thick" countertop.



Waterfall Edge

Slab edge that extends over the side and down to the floor. Sleek, modern lines give the appearance of being wrapped on both ends. This solid surface is easy to clean.

SHELLY'S TIPS

Caring for Quartz

Avoid Harsh Cleaners:

No bleach, acidic or alkaline cleaners. **Never** use acetone. These can damage the surface of the quartz and dull its shine.

Use a Gentle Cleaner for Tough Stains:

Use a non-abrasive household cleaner, like Soft Scrub or Method Daily Cleaner.

Protect Against Heat:

While quartz is heat resistant, **always** use trivets or hot pads under hot pots and pans to prevent any potential damage.

Avoid Sharp Objects:

Quartz is scratch resistant, **not scratch-proof**. Always use cutting boards to prevent any scratches on the surface.
